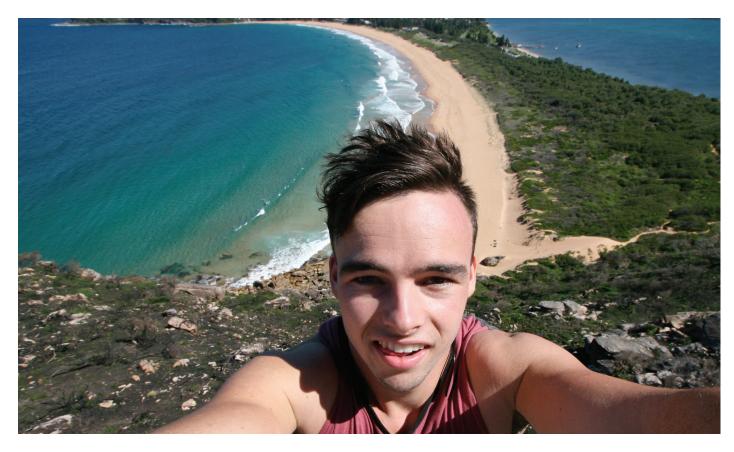




Conversely to the images presented above, the main objective of this selection was not only to capture a clean focus upon the face of the model, but to also capture a unique background to add context to the image.

Different techniques of
Landscape photography
were attempted within
this folder, with framing
and diagonal lines the key
components represented.
In the first image the
coast line is used to direct
the responder along the
Barrenjoey coast allowing
the responder to interpret
the vast scale and beauty
of such an area. Image
three depicts the use of
framing to create



a vivd representation of the destruction of Barrenjoey headland following a horrible bushfire. The lighthouse is used as a focus point in order to engage the responder.



Landscape techniques are further represented in these images with diagonal lines the key component of image two. Image three uses light to create a sense of paradise, while the capture of a small group in the water adds to the context of the image. Image one uses a wide angle lens to create a dimensional sense of being surrounded by the captured environment.





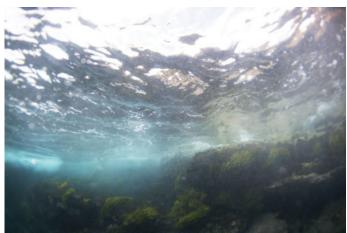




MY THEME

The idea is to create a sense of both worlds wihtin one image, giving the responder a perception of our magnificent underwater environment. Image three's use of colour mixed with black and white further reinforces the notion of two different worlds.
